Cespedes Still Unsigned

Yoenis Cespedes wanted a 6 year, \$150 million deal. Not gonna happen, especially by what he showed in the World Series and parts of the Postseason. Cespedes started out hot after he got signed to the Mets at the trade deadline, hitting 17 homeruns in his first 41 games in the regular season.
