Jets Get Clady

On Saturday, the New York Jets closed a deal with the Denver Broncos. The Broncos traded away 4-time Pro Bowler offensive tackle Ryan Clady in exchange for a 5th round draft pick. The Jets' offensive tackle, D'Brickshaw Ferguson, retired. Ferguson was 32 and expected to play a few more solid seasons. Ferguson protected Jets quarterbacks for 10 years. Ferguson never missed a game due to an injury. Ferguson was a 3-time Pro Bowler, one short of the player taking his place, Ryan Clady. Clady has played for the Broncos for 7 years, appearing in 2 Super Bowls, winning Super Bowl 50. Clady has signed a contract for \$7 million and a club option for 2017. The Jets are now starting their rebuilding period.
